	I. PRESIDENT – REPORT AND CORRESPONDENCE
	[]The garage sale has an address collector on the website that will create a map for residents to organize their shopping plans. Trystan mentioned he knows who to call regarding cheap or free burgers/food from Sobey's/Co-op, barbecue rental/donation, various contacts, etc.
	Could sell physical maps to raise funds for rink build.
	SUM Theatre presenting Mother's Day weekend. Could sell some bagged candy, beverages, as long as we coordinate with SUM Theatre to ensure we don't duplicate.
	Newsletter is coming out in a couple weeks. Garage sale, SUM Theatre, some advertisers, vacancies on the board, etc.
	\$68,000 (\$8000 is from a City Grant) is ready to be used to the rink. If there was a bid that went 2000-12000 over, the association should be ready to cover that shortfall. Some advertising will be sold to cover some of this shortfall. Many businesses in the community will be ready to support the rink once it is built. Varsity View made upwards of \$18,000 on advertising in a much smaller community.

6.0	City Councillor and Community Consultant's Reports
	[] Covid created barriers but Kevin shared his appreciation and gratitude for all of the programming that continued despite the pandemic. Congratulated the community association for making a profit on programming and maintaining volunteers. More in person training is taking place at COS so it's fair to say community associations should be able to get back to basics.
	National Volunteer Week is coming up and it's relevant considering today's meeting revolves around such. May 31st is the indoor programming training date. Mostly will be focusing on newer program coordinators but in the fall, more advanced skill training may be offered.
	Mairin discussed the whistle cessation policy to ask CN on behalf of the RM and Stonebridge residents. The RM is less inclined to participate in the project but the transportation committee at COS will be working within the next 2-3 months in order to have the infrastructure upgrades required to stop the whistle from creating grief for SE Stonebridge residents.
	Some residents have been asking the City to level the top of the birm
	The city is reluctant to grade it but Mairin has stated that the CA could advocate for such a project and she would let us know how to do so.
	Street Sweeping schedule should come out shortly but should take place in May.
	Blair Nelson Park has some plausibility to have some groomed, graded, and/or maintained trails/paths but there are also hurdles for such a project to take place. One of the issues involves accessibility requirements that conflict with the original design of the area.
