2026 SPRING OUTDOOR SOCCER INFORMATION

Registration will be running February 5 – March 13 at <http://stonebridge.rampregistrations.com>. Registrations after March 13 will be charged a late fee and will only be accepted if there is space available on a team.

When registering for soccer, each family also needs an active Stonebridge Community Association membership. Memberships expire on July 31st of each year, so you will need to purchase a new membership for fall registration. We do honour other community's memberships; email us if you have an active membership from another community association. Purchase a Stonebridge Community Association membership at ourstonebridge.ca

OUTDOOR KINDER SOCCER

Learning basic soccer skills while having fun! Coaches are needed - please consider signing up to coach when registering (no experience necessary!). For kids born in 2022. Choose either Tuesday 6pm-6:45pm, Wednesday 6pm-6:45pm, or Thursday 6pm-6:45pm. The season will run for 8 weeks starting in May

Dates: May 1st to June 26th (start date may be delayed - weather & field condition dependent).

Location: Alexander MacGillivray Young Park

Cost: \$75 each

OUTDOOR SOCCER: U5-U9

Outdoor Soccer Season runs May 1 to June 26, 2026. Saskatoon Youth Soccer will schedule the games for U5, U7, and U9. The Stonebridge Community Association does not have control over the schedule. Practices are at the discretion of the coaches and will be scheduled by the coaches. Note that games will be played in parks all around Saskatoon.

Players will require shin guards, socks, and shoes. A team jersey will be provided for the season.

There is no limit for on-time registrations; however, volunteer coaches are required. Please consider volunteering to coach. Certification for coaches is offered through Saskatoon Youth Soccer – any certification fees will be covered by either SYSI or the Community Association. We cannot submit teams to SYSI without a coach for each team. Registrations will be canceled and refunded if the team does not have a coach.

Under-5 COED (Born in 2021) Cost \$125 each: There are 8 (3v3) games played on Mondays (possible occasional Friday) + 3 games at Mini FOS Festival + 1 game at Timbit Jamboree. Practices are TBD at the coach's discretion.

Under-7 BOYS/GIRLS (Born 2020/2019) Cost: \$125 each: There are 8 (3v3) games played Wednesdays (Boys) and Thursdays (Girls) (with possible occasional Fridays for both boys & girls) + 3 games at Mini FOS Festival + 1 game at Timbit Jamboree. Practices are TBD at the coach's discretion.

Under-9 BOYS/GIRLS (Born 2018/2017) Cost: \$135 each: There are 8 (5v5) games played Mondays (Boys) and Tuesdays (Girls) (possible occasional Friday for both boys & girls) + 3 games at Mini FOS Festival. Practices are TBD at the coach's discretion.

BABYSITTING COURSE

The Canadian Red Cross Babysitting course covers everything from managing difficult behaviours to essential content on leadership and professional conduct as a babysitter. Babysitting promises to deepen and enhance the responsibility that older youth feel when caring for younger children. This updated curriculum, complete with new science, also provides improved learning when it comes to giving the appropriate care in the event of an emergency. Aimed at children 11 – 16 years old and interested in taking responsibility for younger children.*

Supervised Family Skate

Supervised family skating time at the Stonebridge community rink is a designated, scheduled period intended for families and casual skaters to enjoy the ice in a safe, calm and relaxed environment. During the family skating time, we ask for no sticks or pucks to be used, to ensure the safety and comfort of all levels of skaters. Supervised family skate times are 6pm to 8pm on Tuesdays, 12pm to 2pm on Saturdays, and 12pm to 2pm on Sundays.

During supervised family skate, a volunteer or community association representative is present to manage the ice, ensure safety rules are followed, and open the warming room in the amenity building.

The supervised family skate times will be cancelled if the temperature is below -25 degrees C.

We are in need of volunteers for the supervised family skating! Please message me if you are able to help out. The community rink needs support from the Stonebridge community, to create a welcoming atmosphere and keep our rink going as a vital part of our community!

When is the amenity building open?

The amenity building will be open during the scheduled supervised family skate times. You should volunteer to supervise the rink! Without supervisors, we can't keep the building unlocked for our local families to enjoy. It's a great way to meet your neighbors and give back!

What's Involved? Greeting skaters and ensuring everyone is playing safe, helping keep the warming shack tidy, and locking up when you leave!

Stonebridge Community Garden

The Stonebridge Community Garden is an allotment agreement between a registered community member and the City of Saskatoon. Allotment means that a plot of land is rented by an individual for growing vegetables or flowers for their personal use. The garden provides an opportunity for city residents to grow food, to meet new friends, share knowledge, and build community. The food grown in each plot belongs to the registered gardeners and cannot be used or sold for any commercial purposes.

Stonebridge's community garden is located in Peter Zakreski Park and consists of 55 allotted plots (41 large and 14 small), two community plots, two raised beds, and a fruit garden. One of the community plots is planted with flowering perennials that help attract pollinators to the garden. Our other community plot is planted with vegetables that are available for anyone in the community to help weed and harvest.

The fruit garden is also a community plot and includes haskaps, Saskatoon berries, cherries, raspberries, goji berries, and buffalo berries. An apple tree was planted a couple of years ago and should begin producing fruit soon.

A small group of dedicated volunteers and many individual plot owners work hard each year to maintain the garden. While the vegetable and fruit community plots are open for shared care and harvesting, allotted plots are privately tended by their gardeners and are not intended for public picking. We appreciate everyone's help in respecting the time, effort, and care that goes into maintaining these individual spaces.

In 2025, the community garden received a \$500 grant from the City of Saskatoon to upgrade our irrigation system. The garden is now fully irrigated with sprinklers on timers that run once a week. In addition, there are hose reels throughout the garden to provide easy access to water for all plots.

Gardeners may keep their allotted plots from year to year if they choose, though a limited number of plots do become available each spring.
